Teepee Trellis

Teepee Trellis

A fun way to incorporate a vertical structure into your garden! These easy-to-build trellises are a good introduction to gardening for children to get them excited and engaged in planting. Simply take wooden support stakes and tie them together at the top in the shape of a teepee. Plant your vegetables and flowers around the outside of the teepee and watch them grow and climb up the supports.

A-Frame Trellis

Let gravity do the work for you and make harvesting a breeze! To construct an A-frame trellis, you will need five wooden support stakes and garden twine. Join two stakes to make an A shape, then use one stake to connect two of the A-shaped structures together at the top. Tie each side with the garden twine at the top of the A-frame, extending it to the ground to anchor it. As your plants grow, they will follow the garden twine up the A-frame trellis.

Arbor and Tunnel Trellis

Create a canopy by trellising vining plants along a wire hoop or arbor. As the plants grow, loosely tie the vines to the structure to ensure support and stability of the plant. The vegetables from these plants will be effortless to harvest as the fruit dangles overhead.

Vertical Wall Planters

Increase your gardening space by adding a vertical wall planter to a patio or balcony for easy access to your favorite herbs or vegetables. With a pallet, plants can be easily tucked into the pallet slots and displayed vertically. Pots can be hung on a pallet or wire frame to add both color and creativity to a vertical wall.
